FREE TUITION for Associate Degree, Certificate & Certified Job Training Programs at BCCC

Giving Baltimore City public high school students a **pathway to success and productive citizenship** is the goal of the Mayor's Scholars Program, an innovative partnership between Baltimore City Community College (BCCC) and Mayor Catherine E. Pugh.

Who is eligible?

- Graduates of Baltimore City public high schools regardless of income or GPA.
- Students must be Baltimore City residents.

How do students apply?

- Complete a FAFSA form no later than the State's priority deadline March 1 at <https://fafsa.ed.gov> and select BCCC code 002061.
- Complete the BCCC admissions application at www.bccc.edu/admissions.
- Fill out the Mayor's Scholars Program application at <https://mayorscholarsprogram.baltimorecity.gov>.
- Participate in YouthWorks summer employment program. Apply at <https://youthworks.oedworks.com>.

What should undocumented students do?

Undocumented students should complete the BCCC application and paper-based financial form, submitted directly to BCCC.

What expenses does the Mayor's Scholars Program cover?

The Mayor's Scholars Program covers BCCC tuition and college fees* only. It does not cover textbooks, transportation, food, etc.

What BCCC programs will be covered by the scholarship?

Students can enroll in BCCC's associate's degree, certificate and job training programs.

Is there a minimum GPA scholarship recipients must maintain?

Students must remain in good academic standing and maintain at least a 2.0 GPA.

How long is the scholarship good for?

The Mayor's Scholars Program is available for 150% or up to 3 years to complete the degree of a student's chosen program at BCCC (equivalent to a 2-year degree).

Can students attend a four-year college for free after graduating?

Coppin State University has offered to provide scholarships to Mayor's Scholars who graduate with an associate degree from BCCC. Depending on student grades and other met criteria, students may be eligible for scholarships and grants at various colleges in the State of Maryland and around the country.

Where can additional help or information be found?

Attend **FAFSA Forward Day, Saturday, Dec. 16, 2017** at the War Memorial Building from 10 a.m. – 3 p.m. to learn more and get hands-on help. Students can also attend one of the FAFSA workshops listed.
