FREE TUITION at BCCC for Associate Degree, Certificate & Certified Job Training Programs

Giving Baltimore City public high school students a **pathway to success and productive citizenship** is the goal of the **Mayor's Scholars Program**, an innovative partnership between **Baltimore City Community College** and Mayor Catherine E. Pugh.

Who is eligible?

- 2018 graduates of Baltimore City public high schools.
- Students must be Baltimore City residents.

How do students apply?

- Complete a FAFSA form no later than the state's priority deadline of March 1, 2018 at fafsa.ed.gov and select BCCC code 002061.
- 2. Participate in YouthWorks summer employment program. **Apply by March 2, 201**8 at youthworks.oedworks.com.
- 3. Complete the BCCC admissions application for Summer or Fall 2018 enrollment by **April 20, 2018** at bccc.edu/admissions.
- 4. Fill out the Mayor's Scholars Program application by **April 20, 2018** at mayorscholarsprogram.baltimorecity.gov.

What expenses does the Mayor's Scholars Program cover?

The Mayor's Scholars Program covers BCCC tuition and college fees*. It does not cover textbooks, transportation, food, etc.

*Consolidated, Facility Capital, Registration Fees.

What BCCC programs will be covered by the scholarship?

Students can enroll in BCCC's associate's degree, certificate and job training programs.

Is there a minimum GPA scholarship recipients must maintain?

Students must remain in good academic standing and maintain at least a 2.0 GPA.

How long is the scholarship good for?

The Mayor's Scholars Program is available for 150% or up to 3 years to complete the degree of a student's chosen program at BCCC (equivalent to a 2-year degree).

Can students attend a four-year college for free after graduating?

Coppin State University has offered to provide scholarships to Mayor's Scholars who graduate with an associate degree from BCCC. Depending on student grades and other met criteria, students may be eligible for scholarships and grants at various colleges in the State of Maryland and around the country.
